

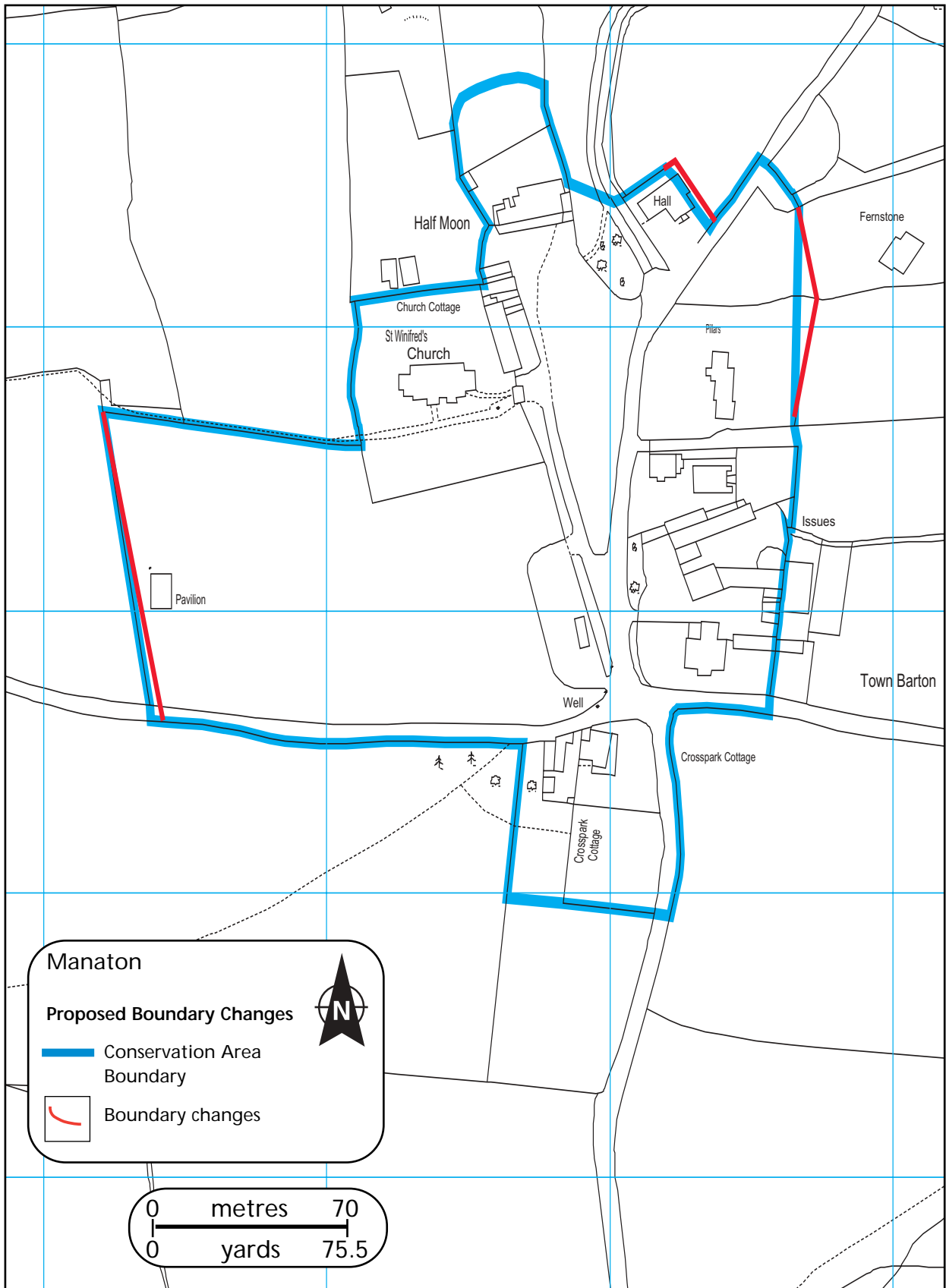
10. Proposed Boundary Changes

The boundary of the Conservation Area was originally drawn to include all the buildings and spaces that have a clear visual association with the green (the hamlet's focal feature) and are an integral part of its setting. In particular, this includes only the part of the former Rectory grounds immediately adjacent to the green. The remainder of the grounds, and the building itself, are considered not to possess sufficient interest and character to merit inclusion, although the tree belt on the west side, and along the slopes of Manaton Rocks to the north and northwest of Half Moon, are recognised as an important backdrop to the hamlet and may therefore be considered appropriate for protection under a tree preservation order.

Also covered by the existing designation are the areas that possess particular archaeological potential, including the site of the 'Old Parsonage' shown on the tithe map, which is now occupied by the Village Hall, and the sites immediately fronting the east side of the green where the remains of former buildings may exist in association with the field strips identified as possibly medieval. The remainder of the strips, extending away from the hamlet, are considered not to possess sufficient potential to merit inclusion, while the protection of their defining hedgerows is covered by the *Hedgerow Regulations* of 1997.

No changes to the Area are therefore proposed, only three minor modifications to align the existing boundary with the property boundaries shown in the up-dated versions of the Ordnance Survey Maps; namely along the west side of the sports ground; the east side of Pillars, and north-east side of the Parish Hall.
