

## Schedule of Changes suggested by the Dartmoor National Park Authority

It also sets out those changes to the supporting text or policies that the Authority considers are necessary to achieve greater clarity of the document and it identifies typographical errors and factual corrections. The changes are expressed either in the conventional form of strikethrough for deletions and underlining for additions of text or by specifying the change.
